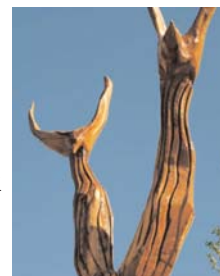

What's in a Boat Name:



What is a Zubenelgenubi? It sounds like something from Dr Seuss. It is not. It is actually a star. Zubenelgenubi is the alpha star in the constellation Libra the Scales. For this boat name we are interested in the abbreviation *Zuben*

Ubi which is short for Zubenelgenubi. If there had not been a way to abbreviate the word then it probably would have to be written down the side instead of on the stern. *Zuben Ubi* is owned by Dave Hale and Gary Garner. When Dave is sail-

ing off shore he enjoys using celestial navigation to determine his position. It was only natural that he name the boat after a star. Zubenelgenubi is Dave's favorite star, commonly used for celestial navigation in the Southern Hemisphere. It never rises above the horizon here in Fairhope so we can never see it here. When using a sextant to take a sight on a star, after measuring the angle between it and the horizon the sailor writes down the angle, the exact time, and the name of the star. With the star Zubenelgenubi however, the sailors use an abbreviated version of "Zuben'Ubi."

Dave is also interested in astronomy and astro-photography. He promises to invite us to join him next time he sets it up.
