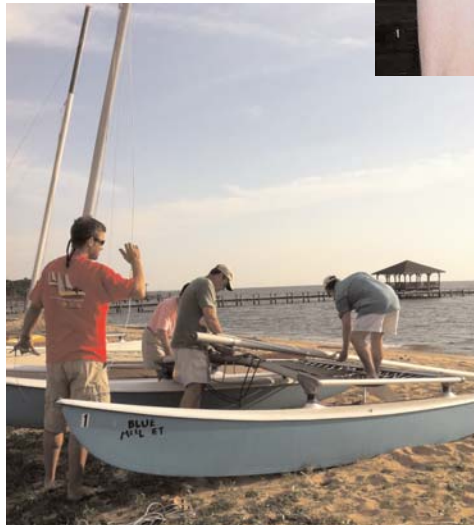

Members may become "**Certified**" and thus able to use the Club Owned Boats by contacting the Adult Sailing Coordinator, Fleet Captain, or Designee to learn about the procedures, how to rig the boats, and demonstrate their sailing abilities. All Members that have already been "**Checked Out**" are considered "**Certified**" and can therefore continue to use the boats they have been checked out on.

A new "**Reservation and Record of Use**" form has been initiated and is located at the bar. It is requested that you fill out the form when you would like to use (reserve) a certain boat. Then when you are finished, please complete the form indicating when you returned and if there was any damaged or missing equipment.

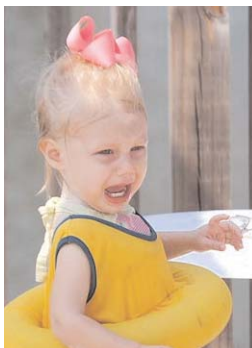
Champagne Brunch-First Sunday every month- This has a hit and we will keep this going since we all like the bubbly! Come down and get your minimum started early in the month!

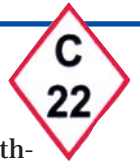

Catalina-22 Fleet 137 News: DI Race/Great Summer Cruise - 2011



Four C22s participated in the DI, starting in rough and confused seas and SSE wind at 15 knots. Norbert Faulk, from N. Al, on *Seawolf* took 1st place with a cracked hull, taking on water; John Helmsteadter, Chris Dawe and Chuck Newman on *Windsong III*

earned 2nd & Pat Noonan, with brother Jerome Knapp, on *Snoopy* did not finish as the rudder snapped near the finish. Cliff Horn from Foley on *Picara* "blew out both sails" but was able to finish.

Sunday, John and Chris sailed on to Ingram's Bayou, Pirate's Cove and Bear Point for the first day of Fleet 137's Great Summer Cruise. Pat and Jerome were able to continue the cruise after borrowing a rudder from Bob Sparks who had trailered from Alexandria LA for the cruise but who did not race.



After an arduous day of motoring in 3 foot seas and 30 knot winds crossing Bon Secour Bay (Jerome began calling the cruise "Hell Week" in comparison to his UDT training) *Snoopy* made safe harbor at Home Port and had libation's at LuLu's. Next morning they joined *Windsong* and together had fine

sailing to Fort McCree at Pensacola where they met the North Gulf Cruise from Fort Walton Fleet 77.



The next day provided another fine sail for all twenty Catalina 22s as they sailed together to Pirate's Cove and Bear Point. A cold front brought high winds and

There was also a tight race for 5th place with *Dirt Rhodes*, David & Plug, and *Church Lady* within 1 minute of each other.

THURSDAY NIGHT RACES

The Thursday Night Races are off and running and after 3 weeks, *Kaotic* (Fred Chasey/Ben Batchelder) is leading the pack with 13 points, with *Damn Yankee* (Rick Byrne), and *New Wake* (Dan Herzog) close behind with 12 and 11 points respectively. There was some confusion (mis-reporting) on what the new course would be, but the correct course for Thursday Night is E - X - SW - S - X - E. No report on the sunsets, but I'm sure they were great.
