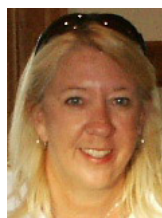

Cruising News: MSD Inspections in the Harbor

Even our friends said we should have our heads examined...

Over 20 boats participated in this spring's MSD inspections in the club harbor on April 16th. The inspections were organized by the FYC Cruising Group. Tom Batty and Jim Henderson from Mobile Yacht Club, both certified "special agents" of the Alabama Marine Police for the purpose of conducting MSD inspections, came across the Bay to conduct the exams. Boats passing the inspections, which are required by Alabama for all boats with installed toilet facilities, were given stickers to verify compliance. Tom and Jim were very complimentary of how well prepared all the participating FYC skippers were.

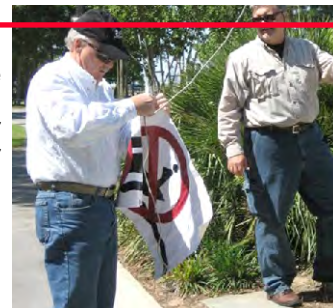
Boat owners should be aware that Alabama law requires that any boat with installed toilet facilities must pass an annual inspection and display an inspection sticker. The inspection helps ensure that the toilet system is protected from inadvertent overboard discharge of sewage in coastal

Failure to pass the required inspection and display the sticker, can lead to boardings and fines by marine police in both Alabama and Florida waters; moreover, improper overboard sewage discharge can lead to substantial fines from the Coast Guard. Any club members who were unable to participate, and who need an MSD inspection, should contact either Cruising Captain Tere Mills or Mike Turner to arrange for an inspection.
