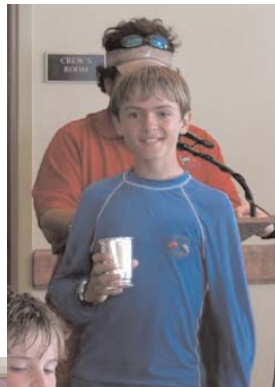

Club VHF Base Station Now Operational

We now have a club VHF base station to support club functions such as regattas, youth sailing, fun racing, safety coordination and other on-the-water activities.

Earlier this year the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) approved renewal of the club's VHF license. In August, a donated VHF radio was installed in the clubhouse bar area.

The base station is available for use by all club members. FCC regulations no longer require users to have an FCC operator's permit. Instructions on use of the base station and FCC requirements are posted above the radio.

Every year we need the same stuff:

1. a completed application
2. a copy of your current boat registration
3. proof of insurance.

★ Application forms are sent in August. Completed documents are to be returned before October 1st. There is a \$100.00 penalty after that date.

★ Everyone on the wet slip wait list and the dry slip wait list must complete the same paperwork. This information must be received by January 1st. There is no penalty for missing the deadline, but if we don't have your new application, we will take you off the list on January 1st.

★ We also ask everyone who has a wet or dry slip and has asked to be placed on the move list, please send in a new written request so we can update those files for 2011.

The Slip Rental Fee will appear on your November bill.

The Helmstadter Report-Thursday club racing report:

Thursday 8/25/2011 Oh what a night ! At 5:30 PM there was not a stick of wind but 4 boats said "Let's give it a shot." By start time there was enough wind (4-5 knots) to move the boats at a reasonable pace and oh the breeze felt good. The sunset actually reflected such that it looked like there were 2 suns. And then there was the finish---WOW. *Kaotic* just nipped *New Wake* by ONE SECOND, with *Damn Yankee* less than 30 seconds behind that. What a great race! *Windsong III* was a long way back, but had a great sail. It is really nice on the water at that

time of day. Hopefully more of you can join us in the future. There was some discussion on when the Thursday Night races ended. Prior to this year they ended on Labor Day. However it was felt that September was a good month for sailing so it was decided the series would go thru the end of September. It is realized that it is getting dark earlier, but maybe the winds will get a little stronger to compensate. Anyway for this year we will go to the end of September just to see what happens. If it gets too dark there just may be less racers.

The Matteis Report-Sunday club racing report:

Sunday 7/31/2011 About 10 boats started this race. The wind was light on the way out and got lighter right at the start and stayed there for about an hour and a half. After several boats had turned onto the final leg of the race, the wind picked up to about 12 with gusts to 15. The forecast storm was trying to form at this point and a few boats abandoned the race. Finishers included Andy Paterson (Wavelength 24), Dan Herzog (J-24), Fred Chadsey (S-2 7.9), Rick Matteis (Olson 25), Jack Ardrey (Tartan34), John Hirsh (Tartan30), Jane Murphy (Pearson30).

Sunday 8/7/2011 Despite the heat, several boats went out to the start. Wind was West and the course was set as W-SW-X-SW-X. After the start, the wind went to near zero with a strong south-going current. It took most boats an hour and a half to make the one mile distance to the first mark. Several boats abandoned the race. The wind then picked up again and backed to SW. Four boats finished: Fred Chadsey (S-2, 7.9), John Hirsh (Tartan30), Jack Ardrey (Tartan34), Jane Murphy (Pearson30). The winning

boat completed the five mile course in two hours and fifteen minutes.

Sunday 8/14/2011 The wind was about 12-14 at the start and continued to build through the day. There were many clouds, but the storms held off until well after the race was completed. The course was X-SW-NW-NE-X. Finishing order was Fred Chadsey (S-2, 7.9), Rick Skinner (e-33), John Hirsh (Tartan 30), Andy Paterson (Wavelength 24), Ultimate 20, Dan Herzog (J-24), Rick Matteis (Olson-25).

Sunday 8/20/2011 Children's Cup - Big Boats 16 boats signed up for the event, including several from clubs other than FYC. The course was set as Start Line (West Mark)-Weather Tetrahedron (T)-SW-X-T-Finish Line (a total of just over 5 miles). The wind at the start was northwest and very light. The wind backed a little and made it difficult to cross the line on starboard. But the start was mostly successful and the boats set up for a short length, but long duration weather leg. The wind continued to back and built a little but never got as high as the forecast 10 knots. Complete results are on the FYC web site.
